

Who Should Participate

Rising high school seniors with an interest in business, civic affairs, and public service will find this program intriguing and inspirational. At the conclusion of the two-day experience, the scholars will return to their home communities with a greater understanding of how business and community leaders work together to improve the quality of life for their area. Students should have earned a cumulative grade point average of 3.4 or above in their high school coursework.

Cost

The cost for meals, lodging on the Huntingdon College campus, materials, and entertainment for the program is \$150, paid by the sponsoring Chamber of Commerce. There is no cost to the student.

How to apply

Chambers of Commerce across the State of Alabama have been invited to nominate one student per Chamber for participation in the 2025 ECDS program.
